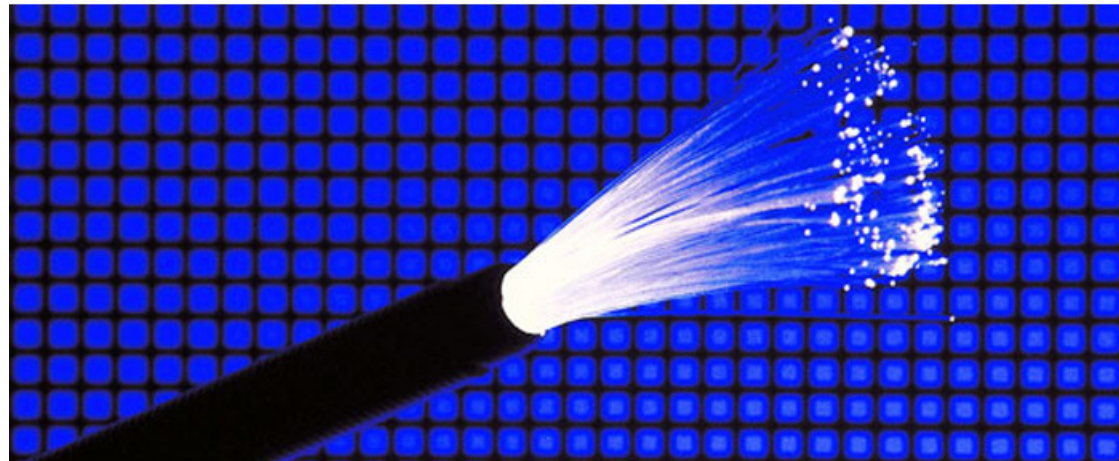
Hackers have found a way round the latest generation of online banking security devices given out by banks.


